Loggerhead Sea Turtle Release Thursday, June 2, 2011 @ 11:00 AM

The **Virginia Aquarium Stranding Response Team** will be releasing three loggerhead sea turtles back into the wild on Thursday, June 2nd, at 11:00 AM at the Cape Charles beachfront.

Stranding Response Program: Marine mammals and sea turtles spend their lives in the ocean, allowing us only brief glimpses into their intriguing world. Unfortunately, these amazing creatures sometimes end up on our beaches, sick, injured or dead. These events are known as "strandings." They can be due to natural causes, or possibly, human interactions. Stranding events provide a unique opportunity for scientists to examine animals that are otherwise difficult to study in their natural habitats.

The Virginia Aquarium Stranding Response Program is part of the Aquarium's Research & Conservation Division. The program is led by a group of trained staff and volunteers who responds to stranded marine mammals and sea turtles along the Virginia coastline and beyond. They work at the Aquarium's Stranding Center in Virginia Beach to rescue and rehabilitate live animals, collect data from dead specimens and support research on stranded marine animals found in Virginia. Most important, through their passion and commitment they serve as environmental ambassadors, educating the public about these magnificent animals and their conservation needs. Tall Ship of Delaware Coming to Cape Charles June 2 - 7, 2011

Kalmar Nyckel, official Tall Ship of Delaware, is coming to Cape Charles! *Kalmar Nyckel* will tie up at the Town's municipal docks the evening of June 2 and stay until departure the morning of Tuesday, June 7. She will be open to the public for tours and day sails.

On Friday, June 3rd, the ship will be open for free deck tours from 1:00 PM - 4:30 PM followed by a public welcome reception at the Harbor at 6:00 PM. On Saturday, June 4th, and Sunday, June 5th, there will be two day sail charters each day from 10:30 AM - 1:00 PM and 3:30 PM - 6:00 PM. On Monday, June 6th, the ship will be open for school visitation from 9:00 AM - 10:30 AM and Noon - 1:30 PM followed by public tours. The day sails are \$60 per adult and \$40 for students under 17. All voyages will last 2.5 hours and leave from the Cape Charles Harbor. **Call 302-429-7447 or 866-659-7447 to make your reservations.**
